### Rural, Remote and Northern Populations - 192 victims

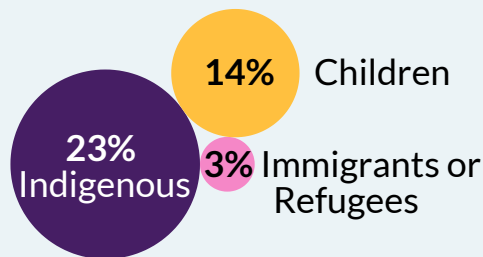
#### PROFILE OF VICTIMS

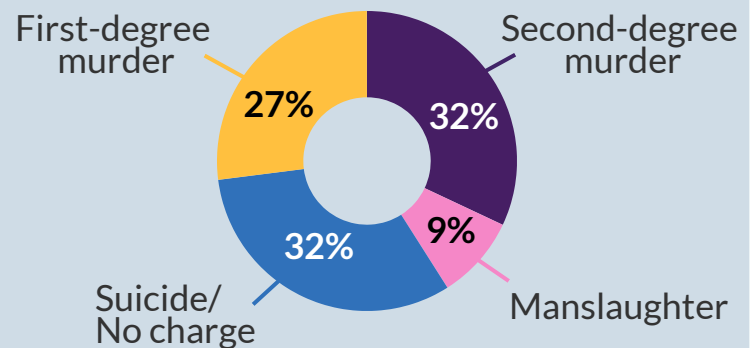

#### Intersections



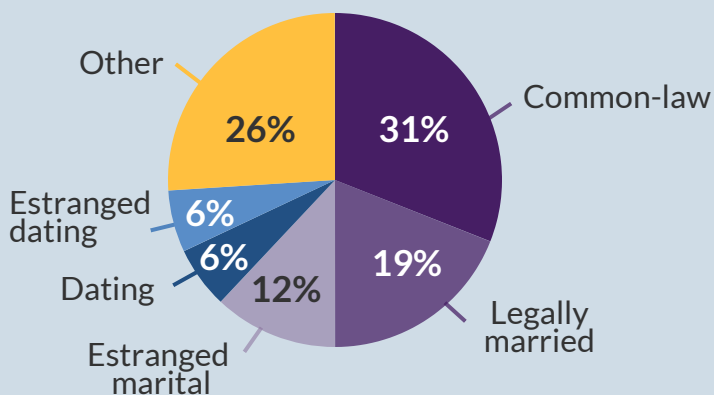
#### CHARGES LAID



#### RISK FACTORS

- 74% of victims were in a current or estranged intimate relationship from the accused
- 26% had evidence of an actual or pending separation
- 29% History of domestic violence
- 36% Access to firearms
