Definition

HBV is described as a collection of practices which are used to control behaviour within families or other social groups to protect perceived cultural and religious beliefs and/or honour.

Definition

"'Honour based violence' is a crime or incident which has or may have been committed to protect or defend the honour of the family and/or community."

Intimate Partner Violence

Definition: **Intimate Partner Violence**

Intimate partner violence (IPV) is domestic violence by a spouse or **partner** in an **intimate** relationship against the other spouse or **partner**. It can include a current or former **intimate partner**, and can take a number of forms, including physical, verbal, emotional, economic and sexual abuse.

HBV

- **HBV is only about sexual control.**

Myths about HBV

Myth 1
Men are not victims of Honour Based Violence or forced marriages.

Myth 2
Only men commit Honour Based Violence, women are not perpetrators.

Myth 3
Women 'at risk' of Honour Based Violence condemn Honour Based Violence.
